



GUIDE FOR VIDEO CLIP EXTRACTION
FROM A VLC PLAYER

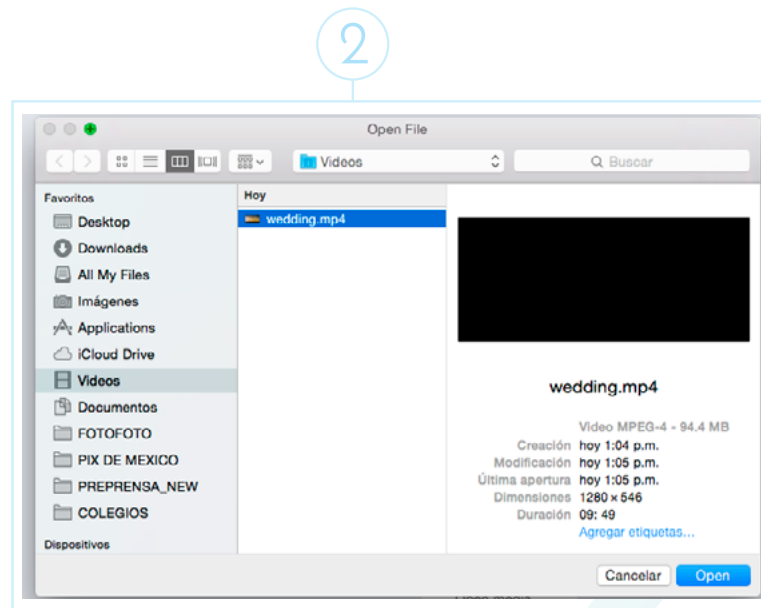
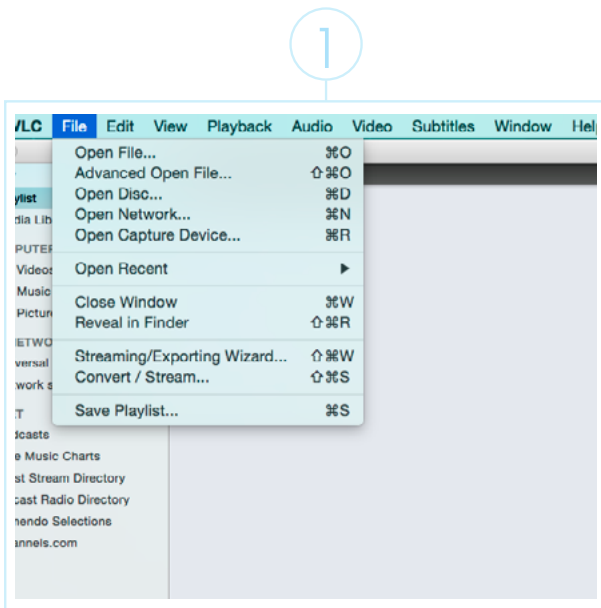
FOR MAC

To cut the video clip it's necessary to use the VLC video player, free software that reproduces different video formats, including DVD and Blu-ray.

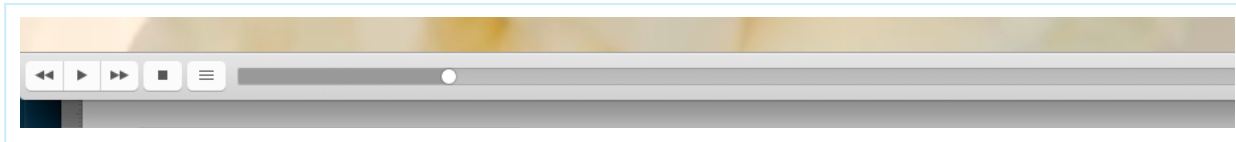
The software can be downloaded from the following link: <http://www.videolan.org/vlc>

1.- Once the VLC is installed, execute it and open the video file you want to extract, to do so:

- Click in the menu “File” in the menu bar and then select the option “Open File” (Image 1).
- A window will open in which you must select the video file you want to extract (Image 2).

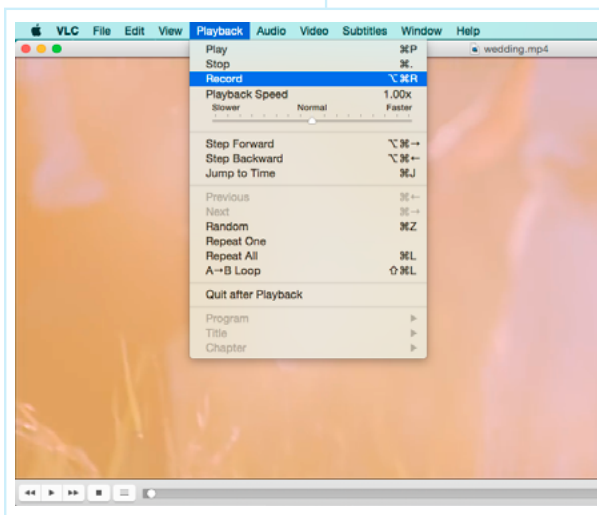


2.- To select the beginning of the clip that will be extracted, place the play position control in the corresponding place.

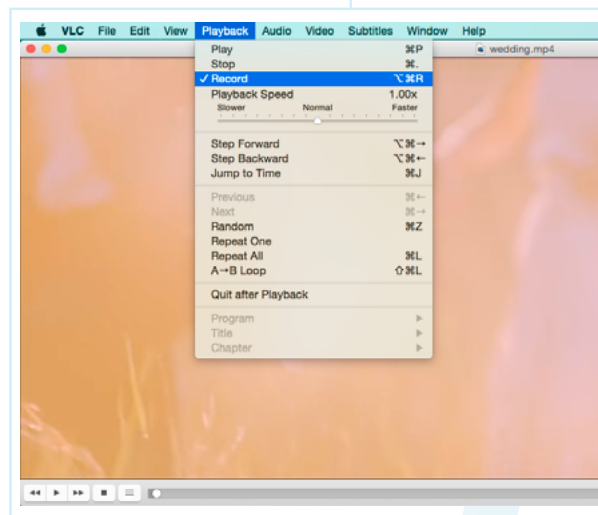


3.- To extract the section of the video that you want to cut we will use the “Record” tab found at the “Playback” menu, in the menu bar (Image 1), when you click on the label, a selection icon will appear (Image 2).

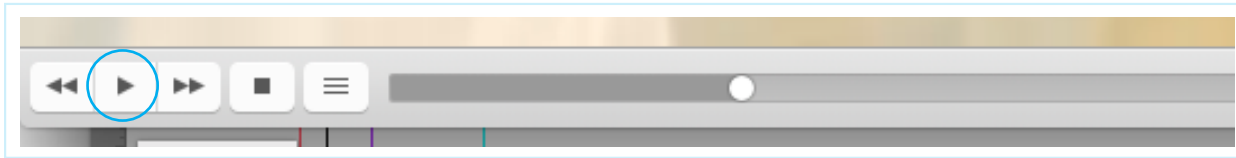

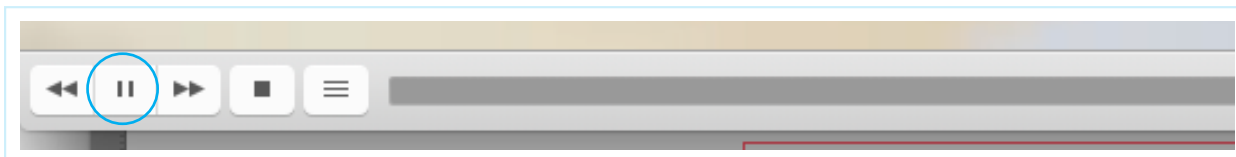

4.- Start the clip's capture process clicking the "Play" button.

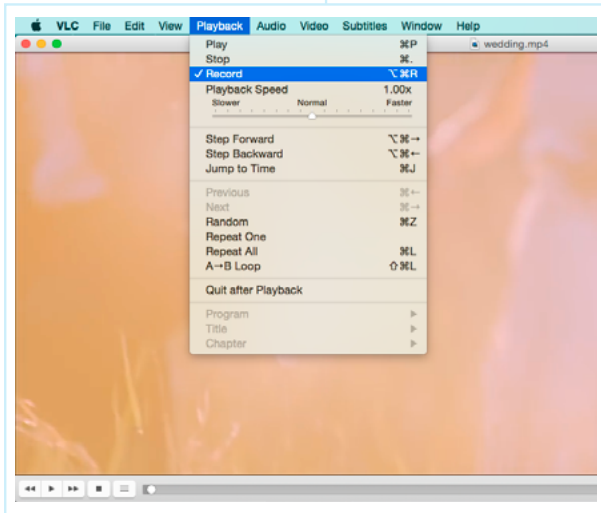


5.- To finish the extraction process of the clip, wait for the video to reach its final wanted end (remember the video clip should last not more than 5 minutes), and press the "Pause" button.

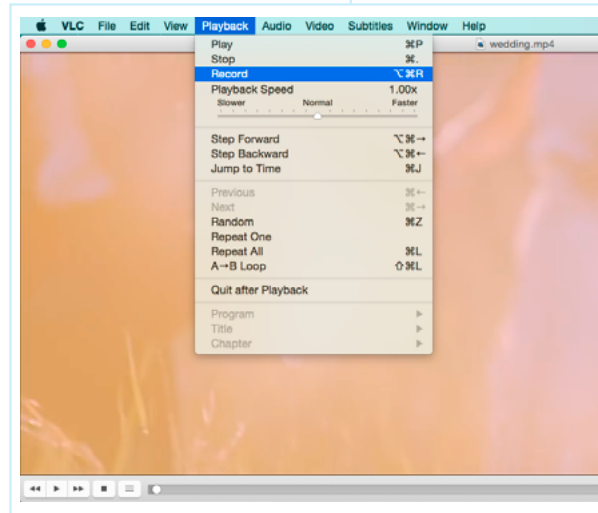


6.- Click on the “Record” tab on the “Play” menu bar (Image 1), the selection icon will disappear and your video will be saved.

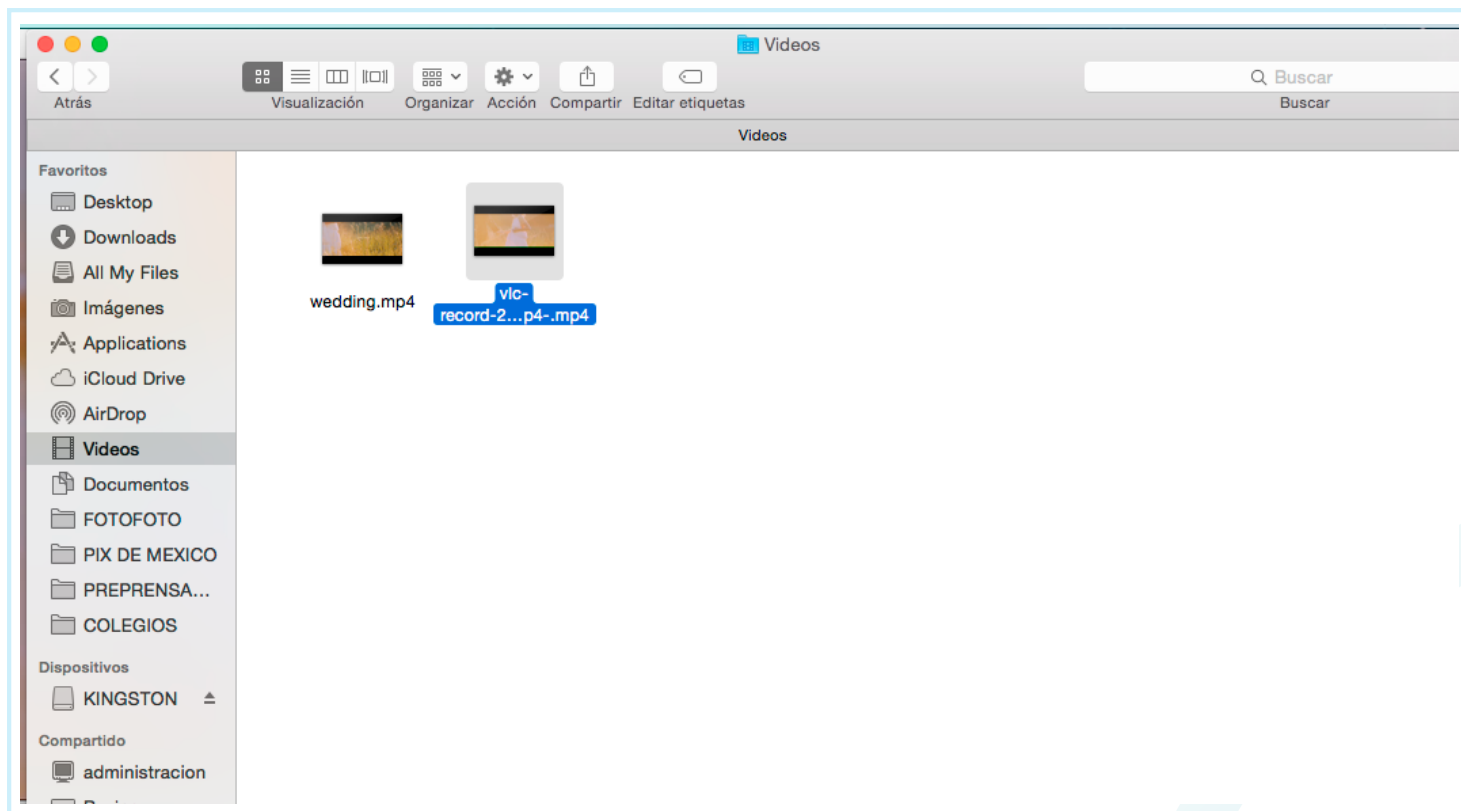

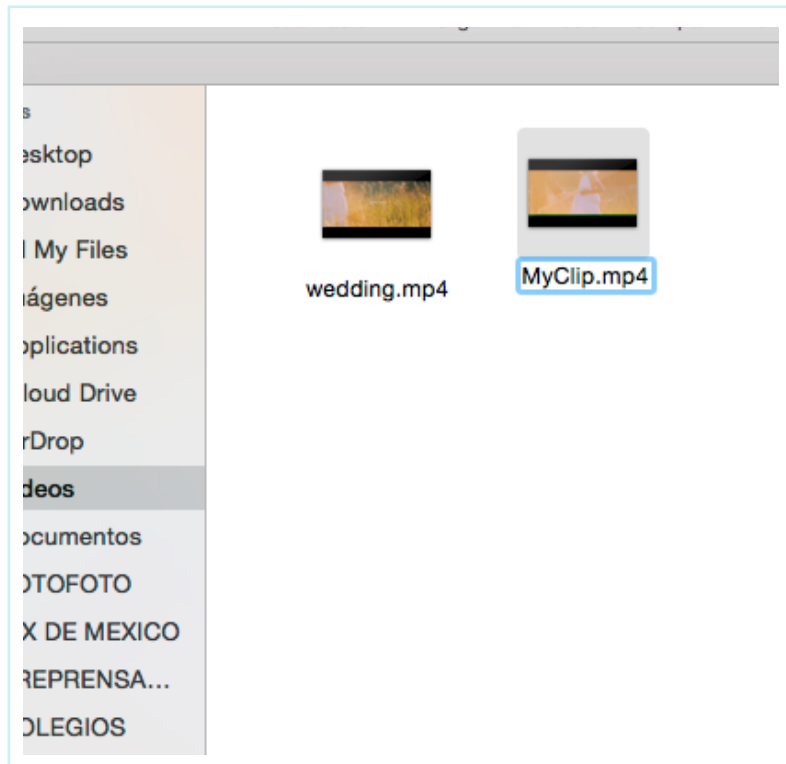


7.- Once this is done, your video will be saved in the “Videos” folder with the necessary format to be visualized in the **Ocean Photo Studio App**.
